Jeremiah 20:10-13

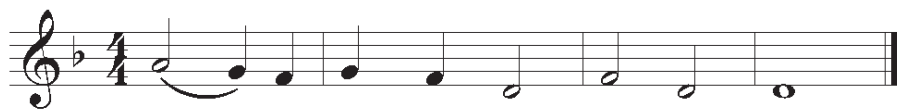
Jeremiah said:

Matthew 10:26-33

Jesus said to the Twelve:

proclaim on the housetops.
And do not be afraid of those
who kill the body but cannot
kill the soul; rather, be afraid of
the one who can destroy both
soul and body in Gehenna. Are
not two sparrows sold for a

small coin? Yet not one of them
falls to the ground without
your Father’s knowledge. Even
all the hairs of your head are
counted. So do not be afraid;
you are worth more than many
sparrows. Everyone who
