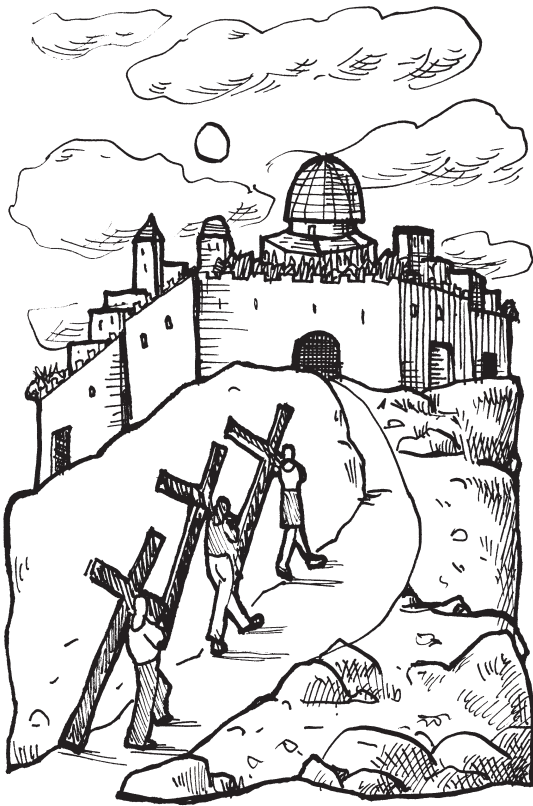

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 20:7-9

brought me derision and reproach all the day.
