


INTRODUCTORY RITES

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON



Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.






Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us. Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, grant us peace.


