On February 22, 1931, Our Lord appeared to Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, a simple nun, bringing with Him a wonderful message of Mercy for all mankind. Saint Faustina tells us in her diary that Jesus said later to Sister Faustina:

“Say unceasingly this chaplet that I have taught you. Anyone who says it will receive great Mercy at the hour of death. Priests will recommend it to sinners as the last hope. Even the most hardened sinner, if he recites this Chaplet even once, will receive grace from My Infinite Mercy. I want the whole world to know My Infinite Mercy. I want to give unimaginable graces to those who trust in My Mercy...” (Diary 687)
